BALLOT TITLE

AMENDS CONSTITUTION: PROHIBITS LEGISLATORS FROM PARTICIPATING IN STATE, LOCAL RETIREMENT PROGRAMS BASED ON SERVICE IN LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY

RESULT OF "YES" VOTE: "Yes" vote prohibits members of the Legislative Assembly from participating in state or local retirement programs by virtue of their service in the Legislative Assembly.

RESULT OF "NO" VOTE: "No" vote retains existing law, which allows persons appointed/elected to Legislature to participate in state, local retirement programs by virtue of Legislative Assembly service.

SUMMARY: Amends constitution. Current law allows persons appointed/elected to Legislature to participate in state/local retirement programs based on service in Legislature. Measure prohibits legislators from participating in "publicly-funded" pension or retirement benefits by virtue of Legislative Assembly service. Defines "publicly-funded pension benefits" as "retirement benefits payable by the Oregon Public Employees retirement System or other program funded in whole or part by the state or local government, but not benefits payable under any federal program." Measure does not affect benefits earned by service in Legislative Assembly prior to measure's effective date. Allows Legislative Assembly members holding office on effective date of measure to accrue benefits for remainder of existing term of office, but not for any subsequent terms in office. RESULT OF "YES" VOTE: "Yes" vote prohibits members of the Legislative Assembly from participating in state or local retirement programs by virtue of their service in the Legislative Assembly.

RESULT OF "NO" VOTE: "No" vote retains existing law, which allows persons appointed/elected to Legislature to participate in state, local retirement programs by virtue of Legislative Assembly service.

SUMMARY: Amends constitution. Current law allows persons appointed/elected to Legislature to participate in state/local retirement programs based on service in Legislature. Measure prohibits legislators from participating in "publicly-funded" pension or retirement benefits by virtue of Legislative Assembly service. Defines "publicly-funded pension benefits" as "retirement benefits payable by the Oregon Public Employees retirement System or other program funded in whole or part by the state or local government, but not benefits payable under any federal program." Measure does not affect benefits earned by service in Legislative Assembly prior to measure's effective date.
